Do you demonstrate respect? Do you demonstrate responsibility?

On your report cards, there is an area designated to indicate whether or not you demonstrate **RESPECT** and whether or not you demonstrate **RESPONSIBILITY**.

This is what I am looking for, from you, so that I can mark YES, this student Demonstrates Respect...

- *Respect yourself by believing in yourself (you are smart and you can do chemistry) and always work to your fullest potential.
- *Respect others by believing in them (your classmates are smart and they can do chemistry) and provide an environment in which they can work to their fullest potential.
- *Respect property – return items that do not belong to you and do not damage items that do not belong to you.
- *Respect your teacher by being attentive and carrying through with the instruction.
- *No name calling, no swearing, no physical contact, no headphones until the teacher gives permission, **NO USE OF CELL PHONES AT ANY TIME** (not even the calculator on your cell phone)!
- *Abide by all of the rules outlined in the BHS Student Handbook, as well as the classroom rules.

- *Come to class everyday, on time, which means to be in your seat **BEFORE** the bell rings, ready to learn.
- *Come to class with the materials needed for class and your completed homework.
- *Ask questions and ask for extra help when you need it – be responsible for your own learning!
- *If you do miss class, get the notes and homework that you missed as soon as possible upon returning. If you know you are going to miss class, get the notes and homework that you will miss ahead of time.
- *Make use of every minute of class. There will be no packing up early. You are to stay in your seat until the bell rings.
