Montessori Method

Follow the Child

Follow the child means allowing children to experience and engage in activities independently. Montessori teachers present lessons to small groups and create an environment encouraging self-direction.

Learning from Each Other

Students learn that their classroom is a community and they are responsible for caring for one another. They learn that their classroom is one small group within a larger community. Information is presented to children in a global perspective with history and cultures at the foundation for greater understanding, community, and peace.

Practical Life Area

The Practical Life Area contains materials that build order, concentration, coordination, indpendence, responsibility, and self-control. All of the work available involves purposeful movement.
