
Building Burlington Leadership Council

BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS

PROUD PROUD

As a system, we have reduced our budget by approximately \$5 million as we move into the 2024-2025 school year due to the failure of the February 2024 operational referendum. Below are the larger adjustments executed to balance the budget:

Closing of Lyons Center Elementary School

One way to reduce our expenses is to operate with fewer buildings. Therefore, the district/school board closed Lyons Center Elementary School for the start of the 2024-2025 school year.



Staffing

The closing of a school building allows the district to become more efficient with staffing. Therefore, BASD has reduced staff by 40+ employees as we move into the 2024-2025 school year.

Grade Configuration & Redistricting

With the closing of a school building and reduction in staffing, the district reviewed our grade configuration and noticed the opportunity to create a new grade configuration which will allow a more effective and efficient educational system for our students and families:

- 4K at Dyer Elementary School
- 5K 4th grade at Dyer, Waller, and Winkler
- 4K 6th grade Montessori at Cooper
- 4K 8 grade Wisconsin Connect Charter at Cooper
- 5th 8th grade at Karcher Middle School
- 9th 12th grade at Burlington High School

In addition, the Burlington community went through redistricting to ensure balance across the district.

BASD has been engaging in learning and training around The Science of Reading for the past two years. The Science of Reading is a body of research impacting primarily the early grades where foundational reading skills are paramount. However, our entire system 4K-12 has been engaging in professional development to ensure our staff are skilled and trained around current best practices when it comes to reading and writing instruction.

Our teaching & learning team has been collectively analyzing our 4K - 12 English Language Arts curriculum and the district has adopted new resources and materials as we move into the 2024-2025 school year for grades 4K - 10th grade. Most of the funding for these materials are coming from ESSER III dollars (federal one time dollars) as the district would not be able to financially afford new materials without grant dollars.

BASD started a Charter School in August of 2023 called WisCo! WisCo is short for Wisconsin Connect Charter School. WisCo provides an opportunity for families who are looking for a personalized educational opportunity for their students learning that is not within the traditional brick and mortar environment.

Students who enroll in WisCo have the option to engage in hybrid (combination of in-person / virtual learning), fully virtual, and/or within a bookbased program option. All 4K-8 grade WisCo students have the opportunity to participate in an in-person enrichment day housed within BASD. The district's goal was to have 40-50 students in the program for the 23-24 school year, but ended the year with an outstanding 80+ students - Amazing growth for WisCo's first year! BASD is looking forward to growing the program and continuing to offer students what they need to thrive.




My favorite part of this year was spending time with my old friends and making new ones. My favorite trip was going to the school forest with my class.
